Dear Parents,

The science department at Palm Harbor University High School strives to provide your child with many opportunities for hands-on learning experiences which will develop critical thinking and the skills necessary for solving problems.

We at Palm Harbor are fortunate to have been equipped with a variety of scientific equipment and supplies which will service our students for many years to come. Activities such as laboratory experiments and demonstrations, however, require many consumable items. Each year Biology students perform dissections requiring a variety of expensive specimens. Advanced Biology students perform research in recombinant DNA, ELISA, (antibody) testing and chromatography. AP Environmental Science students conduct tests on soil and water quality, atmospheric pollutants' effects, and the composition of plastics.

Anatomy and physiology students will study the anatomy of expensive animal specimens. Our Marine Biology students will be investigating the delicate relationships of a marine biome by maintaining saltwater aquariums. Chemistry students investigate many chemical reactions and perform experiments which consume many expensive chemicals.

As you can see, each year students enrolled in Biology, Anatomy & Physiology, Marine Biology, Environmental Science, and Chemistry use large amounts of consumable supplies. To offset the high cost of consumable supplies from the Science Department budget, we would greatly appreciate any small donation you feel is appropriate.
